[M2999n, Howes B-408.] One of the truly classic Lincoln biographies, an Essential Lincoln Bookshelf title, and probably the finest rendition of Lincoln's Illinois years. Unfortunately, the author died before he could get Lincoln to the White House, and the account ends with the last debate with Douglas; this special collector's edition was issued after Beveridge's death. (30)p., ft. portrait of Custer, half title, title, portrait of the author, illus., 8vo., "Hand Painted Ivory Binding." A beautiful production, illustrated throughout by Copeland, drawn and engraved under the supervision of A.V.S. Anthony. Published in a variety of binding styles, we have not seen another like this. A popular song published in various forms, this is most unusual with hand-painted binding, hand-lettered in gold. The edges are scalloped. Custer, from waist up, in full uniform with his medals, is accorded a place of honor as a frontispiece. Very fine copy without cord or silk ties; in publisher's box which is lt. soil & ch.; lacks 1/3 of printed label; the whole presented in ¼ lea. clamshell box w/ gilt lettering on sp. \$575.00

(Lincoln as Inventor) REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PATENTS FOR THE YEAR 1849...Washington: 1850. 31st Cong., 1st Sess., Exec. Doc. #15. 626p., Among the many patentees listed in this volume (include such famous inventors as Colt, Ericsson, Goodyear, and Morse) is Abraham Lincoln, whose patent #6469, issued 22 May 1849, an "Improved Method of Lifting Vessels over Shoals," signed in type "A. Lincoln," appears on p. 262 (his name is also in classified and alphabetical lists on pps. 57 & 96). The invention never drew interest in Lincoln's lifetime, but a variation of the principle has been used in submarines for decades (viz., water-filled tanks which are pumped out for buoyancy). Ltd. ed. of 250 copies, 484p., maps, fold. map. While Little Mac's organizational skills were top notch, his operational career ended with a famous pink slip. By 1863 he was ready to go public with his version of events, including this scarce large format limited edition. Missing sp.; orig bds. attached at eps; bds. bumped & ch. at extrens.; else v.g. Inscribed and signed "For Mr. S. L. M. Barlow / with the sincere regards of his attached friend..." Barlow was a New York attorney and Democratic powerbroker who assisted McClellan with his 1864 presidential campaign. He was once famous for his magnificent collection of fine books and art, of which this was a piece." \$1,250.00
