His excellent and personal memoirs cover action in major battles in both theaters. Since he campaigned under General Lee as well as in the Atlanta Campaign, his accounts serve as a common resource for all modern literature on such battles as Antietam, Chickamauga, and Atlanta. It contains, of course, many fine accounts of the Overland Campaign. Brilliantly illustrated, much in color, often with artwork by the veterans. [Howes F-194, D1057, Eicher 215] A classic, readable narrative of Confederate enlisted life, by a member of Hood's Texas Brigade. One of the rarest Civil War books, and an important resource for Bell Wiley's *Life of Johnny Reb*. Most copies were destroyed in a fire and as such this copy shows the smoke damage on the spine and edges of those few (about 25) remaining; this is one of the better copies with comparatively little damage, internally mostly clean; in ½ gray morocco folding case, w/ gilt lettering & raised bands. \$2,950.00
