Abel, Annie Heloise. **THE AMERICAN INDIAN AS SLAVEHOLDER AND SECESSIONIST; THE AMERICAN INDIAN AS PARTICIPANT IN THE CIVIL WAR; THE AMERICAN INDIAN UNDER RECONSTRUCTION.** Cleveland: Arthur H. Clark Co., 1915-25. 1st ed., 3 vols. (394p.; 403p.; 419p.), fts., plates., maps. [Howes A-9, Eicher #678] A detailed, scholarly study of an almost entirely overlooked aspect of the Civil War. The first two vols. explain the source and extent of Indian support for the Confederacy, while the third concentrates on the general situation in the Indian Territory and its relationship to Texas and Arkansas. Quite scarce and almost impossible to find! Beveridge, Albert J. **ABRAHAM LINCOLN: 1809-1858.** Boston and New York: 1928. 1st ed., 2 vols. (607p.; 740p.), fts., plates. [M2999, Howes B-408] One of the truly classic Lincoln biographies, and perhaps the best chronicle of the pre-presidential years. Unfortunately, the author died before he could get Lincoln to the White House, and the account ends with the last debate with Douglas. Presentation copy from historian Worthington Chauncey Ford (editor, *The Writings of George Washington*) to noted Lincoln collector Oliver R. New York: (1887-88). 1st ed., 4 vols., ft., illus., maps, facsims. [Howes J-145, Eicher #743] “Opinionated and rationalizing memoirs,” but that is why we read them! One of the most quoted in Civil War literature, and rightly so. The earliest printing with the (bright) spine still labeled *The Century Company’s War Book*, rather than *Battles and Leaders*.... Often overlooked are the splendid maps and some of the best engravings ever done relating to the war. A truly essential work --- a classic, if you will --- on the American Civil War. Bound, & re-cased, in ¾ -leather, w/ raised bands, marbled end-sheets & edges; lt. ch. at sp. ends & corners, else a very good collector’s set. \$750.00

Jones, J. B. A REBEL WAR CLERK’S DIARY AT THE CONFEDERATE STATES CAPITAL. Philadelphia: 1866. 1st ed., 2 vols. (392p.; 480p.). [Howes J-220, ITC #104, Eicher #164] The very rare first printing of “the most consulted journal for wartime Richmond and the Confederate government” (Allan Nevins), and a highly important source for the internal history of the Confederacy. Nicolay, John G., and Hay, John. ABRAHAM LINCOLN: A HISTORY. New York: 1917. 10 vols., illus., plates, maps. [M1071, Eicher #409] One of the truly essential works on Lincoln, as much a history of the Civil War as a biography of the man who prosecuted it. Penned by his two personal secretaries, who knew him during the Springfield years and were at the heart of his administration, this set is a gold mine of primary material, contains secondary sources not found elsewhere, is well structured and well written, and for all its understandable biases, is “one of the greatest historical products of its era and is still a necessary source for Lincoln biographers” (Mark E. (Texas) Polley, J.B. HOOD'S TEXAS BRIGADE: ITS MARCHES, ITS BATTLES, ITS ACHIEVEMENTS. New York and Washington: 1910. 1st ed., 347p., ft., plates. [Howes P-465, Krick #401, Eicher #1047] Very, very, very scarce Neale title, written by a sergeant of the title unit, with many recollections by other veterans. Consisting of the 1st, 4th and 5th Texas Infantry (along with the 3rd Arkansas), the Texas Brigade was one of the most famous units of the Army of Northern Virginia, distinguishing itself on the Peninsula and at Second Bull Run, Antietam, Gettysburg, Chickamauga, and the Wilderness. Includes muster rolls of the Texas regiments, photographs and biographical sketches, and the roll of brigade survivors who surrendered at Appomattox. One of the most notable Confederate unit histories, and a highly collectable first edition. V. lt. soil. bds.; lt. overall wear, else v.g.; t.e.g. \$1500.00

[Howes V-34, Eicher #1024] A compendium of information concerning Gen. George Thomas and his celebrated Federal army. Thomas provided much of the basis for this work from his private military journal and official documents. Volume 3 is an atlas. Scarce! Williams, Kenneth. LINCOLN FINDS A GENERAL. New York: 1949-59. 5 vols., 1st eds., except vol. 3, fts., plates, maps, map eps. [Eicher #986] The unfinished jewel in the crown of a fine historian; Williams died before finishing the war. This set, an excellent military analysis, remains a classic rendition of Lincoln's problems in finding a general to lead the Federal armies and successfully prosecute the war.
